
# Our Collaboration with Domino: Amaoti No. 3 Combined School

### Learning from the Crèche



In preparation for grade R we visited multiple Crèches. We gained knowledge on how Early Childhood Development programs operate in South Africa. We played a variety of games that we created from recycled materials and talked to the grade R teachers and principals. We got advice on how to work with non-English speaking children in South Africa and how to plan activities for children aged 3-6. Visiting the different crèches was an eye and heart opening experience.



### Denis Hurley Centre:

The Denis Hurley Centre aims to serve the poorest people in Durban of all faiths, skin color, and ethnic backgrounds. They work with South Africans, as well as refugees. The Denis Hurley Centre offers services through their clinic, feeding center, vocational training, and educational support.

## Our Collaboration with the Denis Hurley Centre:

#### The playroom!

The first project is creating a daycare for children at the Denis Hurley centre. This daycare will allow children ages three and older to play and learn while their parents wait in line for health services. The toys and games were created by the TEN volunteers using recycled materials.



### The Feeding Center

The second project in the Centre will include helping to cook and serve food for homeless individuals in Durban. The volunteers help the relief kitchen prepare 300 meals a day and will be running the kitchen on Christmas so that the DHC staff can enjoy the festive season with their families.
